2023-2024 School Improvement Plan Review: Matt Christensen

- SFHS will increase our inclusivity opportunities by focusing on differentiation and diversity.
 - Measurement: Number of students in the LIA/ESL class will increase, and we will provide opportunities for all kids to feel welcome and supported: Clubs, trackers/advocates, Teresa, Diversity ML Classes.
 - Celebrations: ML at 30% (leading the district).
 - We took .5 FTE and added 4 core classes with Spanish speaking teachers to reach about 30 of our lowest ML students.
 - ML Parent Night November 8th
- The percentage of SFHS students performing on grade level or making progress on end

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of level assessments will increase in language arts/reading, math, science, and other subjects.

- October Minutes Posted to SFHS website (SCC Page)
 - Motioned by Josh & Second by Dawn
- SCC Superintendent Meeting Update: Shanni. They spent a lot of time discussing the new buildings. Each of these schools is being built to hold 1650 students. There were lots of questions about boundary changes, etc. There is no plan to change boundaries at this time for secondary schools. A short discussion regarding boundary changes came forward by members of the council. Shauna did a great job at helping to clarify questions. Matt also discussed how a boundary change would influence athletes. They also discussed the security and safety features of the new building.

School Board Member Presentation & Questions: Shauna Warnick

- Shauna took some time to thank the SCC, teachers, admin, etc. She complimented the atmosphere & culture of SFHS - specifically with athletics. She opened the door for questions at any time.

SFHS Update: Matt Christensen

- Term 1 Data:
 - 1547 total students
 - 806 total students on the honor roll
 - 312 students with a perfect 4.0
 - 297 students with high honors 3.75-3.99
 - 195 students with honors 3.5-3.74
 - 271 students are on track in all subjects (C average)
 - 211 students are at risk academically (D average)
 - 241 students are failing academically (1 or more F)
 - 1,084 Students with 90% attendance
 - 308 students with 80-90% attendance

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- 102 students with 65-80% attendance
- 38 students attended less than 65%
- Matt took some time to discuss our “sister school” Landmark and how it is not a behavior school, but is specifically for students who need a little push with academics and/or attendance.
- New School Update - May 20th is our ribbon cutting ceremony. Matt invited the council to be there for that. Matt shared some background about why the cutting is in May and not August. Matt also talked about how the admin has been taking focus groups out to the new building and the purpose behind them.
 - Question (Karla): How many parking spots will be at the new school?
 - Eventually when everything is done (old building torn down, etc) we should have around 1400 spots. It will take a little bit of time, but we will get there. Concerns were brought up in regards to the parking at the church and students crossing the street.
 - Shauna brought up how it has been tricky, but it has been on top of their (the board’s) minds as well.
 - Question (Karla): I’ve heard that there will be an I-15 exit here on Center Street. Is that true?
 - UDOT is doing a study right now, but that will be 10+ years down the road.
- Raptor Training - At our monthly faculty meetings we are practicing our safety app & drilling with the new system. We have been working on some of the kinks & trying to dial down the new app & system as it was different that we used last year.

ML Parent Night: KyLynn

- November 8th, 2023 we held SFHS first ever “Parent Night” for our Spanish speaking families to better help support them in understanding how to help their students.
 - We had about 10-12 families who came and the feedback was nothing but positive.

Counseling Update: Dawn

- Meeting with each of our teams right now to help build the master schedule as our new building does change the classes that we are able to offer to our students.
- Class changes for Semester 2 are now available and open. Dawn explained how the class change process goes. She explained how it is fair & easier to get through. There will be no class fee charges for the next month.

Term 2 Data: 1505 total students

- Grades
 - 743 total students on the honor roll
 - 297 students with a perfect 4.0
 - 276 students with high honors 3.75-3.99
 - 170 students with honors 3.5-3.74
 - 750 (50%) students are excelling in all subjects (lowest grade was a B)
 - 234 (16%) students are on track in all subjects (lowest grade was a C)
 - 215 (14%) students are at risk academically (lowest grade was a D)
 - 290 (19%) students are failing academically (1 or more F)
- Attendance
 - 885 (59%) students with 90 % attendance
 - 367 (24%) students with 80-90% attendance
 - 167 (11%) students with 65-80% attendance

Jaime shared the data from Term 2.

School Updates: Matt

- Governor Cox's cell phone statement.

Jaime shared the information in Cox's statement. Most members wanted a printed copy of the statement and that was provided. Bret asked "does the teacher having control over the policy cause issues for the teacher?" Ellie shared how she creates a policy alongside the students and that helps with any backlash and maintains the relationship. Josh allows students to use them during his class 'halftime'. He says that approach lessens any issues. He mentions that their employer isn't going to take their phone from them. Alyson agreed with points made by Josh.

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Jami was pleased to hear that our teachers do not feel like they have to allow phones to maintain relationships.

Trustlands Plan: Jaime/Matt

- Review Current Trustlands Plan
 - Goal: The percentage of students performing on grade level or making progress will increase in English/Language Arts, Reading, Math, and Science. We will look at ACT and Aspire Plus Test results to measure our goal.
 - Action Steps:
 - 1. 2.5 FTE to reduce class sizes in English, Math, and Science.
 - 2. Purchase Chromebooks to maintain 1 to 1
 - Using funds to:
 - Hire teachers and pay for salaries/benefits (\$156,000)
 - Purchasing Chromebooks (\$80,665)
 - Ideas for next year's plan
 - Still waiting on final FTE budget numbers

Counseling Update: Dawn Draper

Counseling is in full swing. Class changes took place over a 30 day period. Next year the plan is to start class changes earlier in November so there is more time for in person meetings before the semester break. Alyson mentioned how important it is for our counselors to be free to meet with students who need mental health services, which absolutely need to be in person. Micah mentions that announcements were a good place to advertise the form. Let's add it to an advisory period next year. Students had questions about what could be replaced with different things for credit.

Sophomores are being registered in English currently. 15 minute appointments with parents can be made on Calendly if there are questions. Junior CCRs start on Monday - those are scheduled. Added an accountability form to the registration process this year.

Advisory class period will be used to double check that all students are registered prior to the end of the registration window.

Josh reminded the group that hiring is dependent on numbers found in registration. It is important that students take the process seriously.

"Unscheduled/See Counselor" class - students should still complete the class change form prior to going to the counseling office. This is explained in the email that goes out to students.

Master concurrent enrollment planner page is available. COMM and PHIL being offered next year.

Trustlands and TSSA Funds: Jaime/Matt

- Plans are due March 22nd
- 2023 Data:
The percentage of our students with a composite ACT score of 18 or above was 64.5%. The percentage of students testing above 18 in the four categories are as follows: English- 59.56%, Reading- 67.65%, Math- 58.09%, and Science- 70.6%. On the Utah Aspire Plus test, our proficiency levels are as follows: English- 37.11%, Reading- 29.35%, Math- 23.33%, and Science- 22.53%. Our predicted ACT average by test is as follows: English- 17.85, Reading- 18.88, Math- 18.87, Science- 19.18.
- Trustlands funds are used for:
 - Hiring teachers and paying for their salaries
 - Purchasing Chromebooks
 - We have approximately \$237,000 to use

FTE amounts should be known at some point this week or next.

Matt shared some thoughts of using Trustlands for about 3 teachers. Discussion about how the teachers who don't take insurance and are newest on the salary scale are the ones who are paid out of this money. Also use about \$60,000 to pay for some new student chromebooks (those are about \$300 per chromebook).

Josh asked about projections of additional students with incoming sophomores. We are told that about a 50 student increase is coming. However, with the new building, it is very likely that the number will grow significantly. Matt explained how we use buying out teacher preps to accommodate growth. Doing so does lead to teacher burnout, though. So as much as it can be avoided is helpful so using these funds for teachers is helpful.

The council agrees with these ideas for the coming plan.

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Discussion about chromebooks and the good quality and needed services was brought up.

- TSSA funds are used for:
 - Student advocates, Teacher salaries, Chromebooks, ESL Class (English as a Second Language), LIA Class (Latinos in Action), Professional Development for teachers

ACT and ASPIRE Plus Test Information: Jaime

- ACT for Juniors
 - Test Day - March 20th
 - Makeup Day - March 27th
 - Information being sent to parents today and each week until the test

Superscoring for ACT was brought up. There doesn't seem to be any thoughts of moving forward on this. UVU is the only school as of the college days that has mentioned looking at subscores for scholarships - the students have to reach out about that.

- Aspire Plus Test for Sophomores
 - Testing towards the end of April, first of May

Jaime has a meeting this week to get more information on how this will look this year.

Jami asked about an ACT boot camp happening in March that she thought she'd gotten information about. Our school does not have anything arranged or know about any outside entity that does. Jami will let us know if she finds what she thought she'd seen.

Trustlands Plan Proposal/Vote: Matt Christensen

- Proposing to keep this year's plan similar to last year's like we've discussed over the last few months:

The percentage of students performing on grade level or making progress will increase in English/Language Arts, Reading, Math, and Science

- We will look at ACT and Aspire+ Test results to measure our goal.
- Action Plans
 - Use 3 FTE to reduce class sizes in English, Math, and Science.
 - Purchase Chromebooks to maintain a 1 to 1 school. This enables students to utilize online/digital learning resources in their English, Math, and Science classes. (also beneficial since ACT and Aspire+ assessments are taken on the chromebooks)

Matt - 3 FTE, need to factor in 5% increase to salary, \$38,760 for Chromebooks, \$285 each - sliver of the \$ to pay for Chromebooks

Brett Bills - loves the focus for the money is on teachers

Matt Christensen - we plan and then summer happens. Start with classes @ 28

Term 3 Data: 1,470 Students

- Grades
 - 795 (54%) students are excelling in all subjects (lowest grade was a B)
 - 245 (17%) students are on track in all subjects (lowest grade was a C)
 - 188 (13%) students are at risk academically (lowest grade was a D)
 - 230 (16%) students are failing academically (1 or more F)
- Attendance
 - 940 (64%) students with 90 % attendance
 - 302 (21%) students with 80-90% attendance
 - 163 (11%) students with 65-80% attendance
 - 60 (4%) students with less than 65% attendance

Jaime Christensen - went over data. Things didn't drop much from 2nd to 3rd term

Matt - 1200 of the 1500 kids come to school the majority of the time

Matt - MMHS is very similar to ours, Salem is probably pretty similar

Avoiding Discriminatory Language [Presentation](#)

- Feedback?

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Matt - emailing out to stakeholders, rolling out to our 2nd period classes next Tuesday. Example - out near the stadium and a student yelled something inappropriate after school to a friend. Matt called a kid out on the language and educated them on the word and why it wasn't appropriate.

Jami - will this be going to coaches.

Matt - Code of Conduct for coaches

Karla - not just discriminatory, but language in general is the focus

Jaime - focused around "Here we learn for LIFE" model, highlighting what we do that is good with our inclusion students, cite district policy, define discrimination why to avoid, give specifics to be clear with expectations, presenting to teacher/staff on minimum day on Wednesday, Brett - kids from the middle school didn't know what the "N" word was. Did allow for a good conversation with younger kids.

Alyson - as a parent, grasp the information and teach them what you want them to know.

Josh - conversations will probably not have the same support at home. Things are not fine at school that might be fine other places. These things are not acceptable here at school.

Matt - every one of these things are happening here.

Ellie - it is never ok to make fun of people

Jaime - what will happen, steps for faculty and how to reduce instances

Alyson - had a situation happen while she was subbing. The district is really taking this serious and she was asked about this 3 times

Shanni - can coaches be encouraged to be better

Matt - yes to addressing this with coaches! doing during 2nd period not advisory. Pulling down kids that aren't there and catching them

Josh - not in the classroom and ok on the field
